NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta shall be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017 - 2020*(RRS).
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Sail Canada shall apply. The prescriptions are available at http://www.sailing.ca/images/uploads/SC%20Prescrip_Arbit%202013-16.pdf
- 1.3 The RRS shall be changed as follows: the Sailing Instructions will amend Rules 41 and 90.2(c) for the Green Fleet.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 Registration will be open for the following classes: Optimist, Laser, Laser Radial and Club 420. Other dinghy classes able to provide five (5) registrants by close of registration are welcomed.
- 2.2 If sufficient entries are available, a Green Fleet may be established in the Optimist Class.
- 2.3 Eligible participants may register on line at <http://rnsys.com/regatta-registration.html> before 2000 June 7th, 2019. Competitors may register on-site during Check-in from 0900-1000 Saturday June 8th in the Marine Activities Centre (MAC).
- 2.4 Required Documents at Check-in:
 - 2.4.1 Skippers must present proof of membership in a club affiliated with Sail Canada.
 - 2.4.2 All participants must submit a parent/guardian declaration, including a waiver of liability and a medical authorization form signed by a parent or coach if the participants are under 19 years of age. These documents can be completed electronically as part of registration.

3. FEES

- 3.1 Required fees are as follows:

	<u>Regular</u>
Single-handed dinghies	\$75
Double-handed dinghies	\$95
- 3.2 Early bird discount; register before June 3rd and save \$30.

4. FOOD

- 4.1 A barbecue will be held on Sunday afternoon, the cost of which is included in the registration fee.

5. SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Registration/Checkin is on Saturday June 8th 0900 – 1000.
- 5.2 There will be a competitors' meeting at 1030, Saturday June 8th.
- 5.3 The schedule of racing will be as follows:

Time of First Warning Signal	1200	1100

5.4 No warning signal will be made after 1500 hrs on Sunday June 9th.

6. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available at on-site checkin.

7. RACING AREA AND COURSES

Competitors will sail on windward-leeward and/or trapezoid courses in Halifax Harbour.

8. SCORING

8.1 Two (2) races are required to constitute a series.

8.2 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

8.3 When 5 to 10 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

8.4 All classes will sail a maximum of 10 races.

9. SAFETY

All participants shall wear adequate personal flotation devices at all times while on the water.

10 PRIZES

Prizes will be given to the top three competitors in each fleet in classes where there are more than 7 boats.

11. INSURANCE

It is the competitor's responsibility to have adequate third party liability coverage in effect for the event. Insurance will not be checked at registration.

12. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk; see Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage, or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
